## NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH



Approximately 1.8 million children received prevention services in fiscal year 2021.

Approximately two-thirds of victims received postresponse services (such as family preservation, family support, or foster care) because of needs discovered during an investigation or alternative response.

During fiscal year 2021, fewer than one-quarter of confirmed victims were removed from their homes because of an investigation or alternative response.

# Children's Memorial Flag Day is recognized on the 4th Friday in April each year





### FACTS ABOUT CHILD ABUSE

- An estimated 1 in 10 children will be sexually abused before age 18.
- In 90% or more of child sexual abuse cases, the child is abused by someone he or she knows and trusts.
- 60% of children who are sexually abused are abused by people the family trusts.
- An estimated 9 out of 10 cases of child sexual abuse are never reported.
- The average sexual abuse "incident" is not a one-time event. Rather, it is an ongoing cycle of exploitation that lasts for one or more years.
- Sexual abuse of children occurs in every class, race, religion, neighborhood, cultural and ethnic group.
- The National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect estimates as many as 100,000 to 200,000 children are physically abused each year. Five times as many are neglected.
- Abuse is the second leading cause of death, behind Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, for children 0-5 years of age.
- Domestic violence is any physical or emotional behavior perpetrated by one person toward another to control the other person's behavior, regardless of injury or frequency of incident.
- Children in homes where domestic violence occurs are physically abused or neglected at a rate 1500% higher than the national average.



TIPS TO REDUCE YOUR CHILD TO

### FEEL LESS ANGRY & EMOTIONAL

01.

MAINTAIN CONTROL OF YOUR OWN EMOTIONS & ABSTAIN FROM OUTBURSTS OF ANGER.

02.

WHEN YOUR YOUNGSTER DEMONSTRATES GOOD CONDUCT, PRAISE THEM EARNESTLY.

03.

WHEN YOUR CHILD ENCOUNTERS A DIFFICULTY, ASSIST THEM IN PROBLEM SOLVING.

04.

ASSIST YOUR CHILD IN EXPRESSING HIS OR HER FEELINGS VERBALLY OR VIA COPING MECHANISMS SUCH AS STOMPING

05.

AVOID PLACING YOUR KID IN AN UNPLEASANT ATMOSPHERE OR PROVIDING THEM WITH TOYS THAT ARE TOO SOPHISTICATED FOR THEIR AGE.

The Nursery was founded in 2001 as a child-abuse prevention program. Protecting children is at the heart of their mission. The Nursery helps kids thrive and become resilient in the face of early traumatic experiences.

- Nursery goals include supporting Resource Family Recruitment and Retention efforts and help ensure a smooth transition for new foster and kinship children by providing the following two programs:
- Daycare (at no cost) available to foster/kinship families during the first 30 days of placement.
- Occasional "drop-in" daycare (at no cost) available to foster/kinship families. You must make an appointment to complete a registration package and meet the staff.
